Balancing Calories

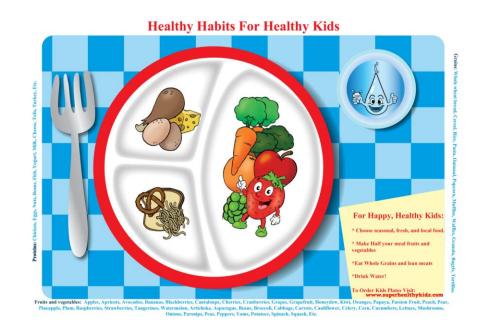






Foods To Increase

Snacking is vital to little growing bodies! Kids need to eat smaller meals, more often because they have smaller stomachs! Breakfast Ideas

- Mix cereals. Try half plain cheerios with half honey nut cheerios. If kids (or you) love sugary cereals, try ½ cup favorite cereal with ¾ cup healthy alternative.
- Smoothies. Blend juice, yogurt, and frozen berries. Favorite add-ins. Protein powder, flax oil
- Yogurt, fruit and cereal

Lunch Ideas

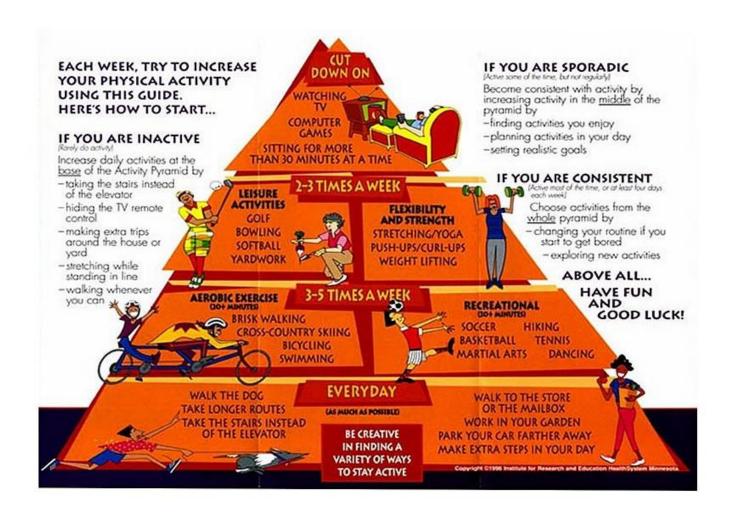
Empower The Kids

- Educate the kids on reasons to eat well. They will be happier, have more energy, grow big muscles, get smarter, be sick less often, etc.

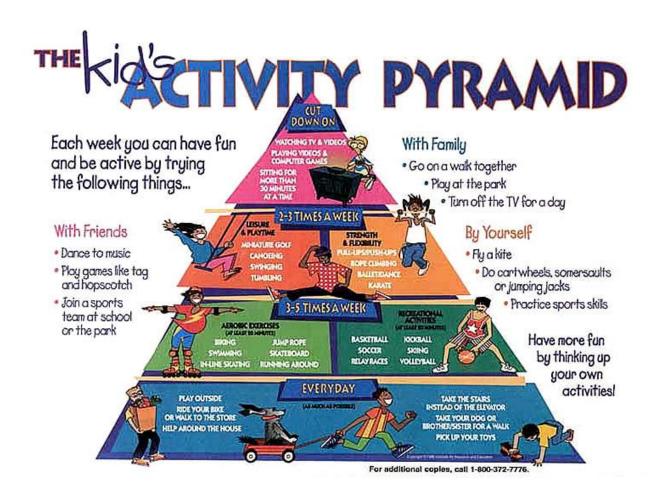
Fitness
